The Grand Valley Highland Games exceeded expectations with a number of athletic events that aren't typical to "name brand" sports in the U.S.

These strongman competitions began in 1040 AD. under the direction of Malcolm Canmore to select the most able body men to be soldiers. The games grew in popularity, but took an epic hit when the Jacobite Rebellion was dismantled and an Act was passed banning Scottish dress for nearly 40 years. These games were slowly revived and started becoming a strong tradition in Scotland and the U.S. to retain Scottish Identity and Cultural heritage (https://www.scotland.org/events/highland-games/about-highland-games).

Locally, we have only had 3 Highland Games which Sharon Taylor of Taylor's Croft has been kind enough to help orchestrate. The first in 2019, then the forced Covid break we all endured and finally getting back into action with last year's and 2022.



NORTH AVENUE



There's no arguing the construction on North Avenue is a headache. Some even say it's hurting them financially. We can certainly see from the 1st & Grand Avenue's Burger King that construction in front of your business is no joke. That place has been there longer than memory serves.

It seems like they planned this construction for the school year! It is Colorado, so it's necessary to do the construction when they can; however, the one lane shut downs going to and from the schools along North Avenue coincidentally happened right when school started or let out. Maybe it only seems that way because those times are now Grand Junction's rush hour.

Whatever the case, Cassaundra

from Redeemed Treasures says, "You just tend to avoid North Avenue all together, I know I do." Located just passed 29 Rd. on North Ave, Cassaundra says her business Redeemed Treasures and the liquor store next door have taken a major hit. "There was no warning; they just came in and started tearing everything up one day."

Now you may have to fear the construction will end up in front

of your means to a meal, and some areas on North look as if they are just completely ignored.

We aren't talking about just one end of North either. Both sides are mangled beyond recognition. Progress seems nonexistent. They patch what the were doing with sloppy piles of asphalt and move to the next spot. We can all be thankful 1st & Grand Avenue was finished in one fell swoop, even if businesses around them failed in the construction's wake from how long it took.

Research found that the construction on North is two different projects. One ran by Ute water and the other a cooperation between Xcel and CDOT.

Both project managers refereed to spokespersons for answers to an end of the construction and a restoration in sight.

Brad McCloud with Xcel Energy was quick to respond. He says the project on the West end of North towards 12th is where Xcel and CDOT are collaborating on a project to relocate street lights. Brad says the individual project managers communicate with each other to minimize the mayhem, but the work should be done by fourth quarter.

Elise Thatcher, Regional Communications Manager from CDOT says, for outreach purposes they have tried to contact business owners and keep an open line of communication, sometimes it's necessary to buy prop-



erty around areas for putting in sidewalks and widening lanes. She says the planning for these projects is a couple years.

Maybe the line of communication broke down between landowner and small business owner. If a landowner tells his tenets that construction is coming, the land owner won't have leasers.

However, Andrea Lopez, External Affairs Manager for Ute wa-



ter says, "The District designed, went to bid, and awarded a contract to replace aging water facilities from 29 Road to I-70 Business Loop along North Ave. The District awarded the contract to K&D on October 5, 2021". Which would not have been enough time to notify anyone if construction started in November 2021.

We can all expect delays and stagnation throughout the summer and into next school year on North Avenue.

Resurfacing of the road is expected to happen this year. We can look forward to devastating **potholes** like the this one heading westbound in front of Wells Fargo to be a tire traumatizing bad dream.


