sibly the whole town.


The Palisade Art Festival delights us with uniqueness and the Gem & Mineral show sparkles with radiance. So take a look!

on their website the annual event attracts "over 5,000 people from across the Western Slope". Make sure you checkout the *Cosplay* at future Comic Cons!




Festivals, is excited to bring the show some much deserved attention and appreciation. Though they have done other Art Festi-






