# JUNCTION Connection

The Grand Junction Veteran's Day parade is a continued celebration of Vets across the county. The ceremonies held the day before in Fruita and Grand Junction commence the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month at the 11<sup>th</sup> hour, explaining the significance.

Everyone came out to celebrate; from the young, quiet Boy Scouts of pack 318, to loud motorcycles and marching bands stepping in cadence with their salute to our Armed Forces. Shown just below to the right, was one of the last participants in this year's parade, but the first to be mentioned. A small

pack with big intentions, Boy Scout pack 318 who could very well be the youngest members of the

community to show support. As they follow, braving the cold with smiles and red faces, it's a reminder that everyone should take the time and effort to honor those who serve.

The deep rumble coming down Main Street was from motorcycles of the Patriot Guard Riders seen at the top right in Fruita.

The Marching Bands of Palisade, Fruita and Grand Junction high schools played exquisitely, showing off skills they must have fine tuned all year, it would seem, just for this occasion.

Jim Doody, seen to the bottom right on Veteran's Day in Fruita, reminds everyone why November 11<sup>th</sup> at 11am is historically significant; because it marked the end of one of the bloodiest wars the world had ever seen, World War 1. Known as Armistice Day until 1954, the name was officially changed to incorporate all Veteran's since we had faced WW2 and the Korean War.


For Jim, this day and the memorial behind him located in Fruita, holds the most significance. As the founder of the Vietnam Veteran's War Memorial in Fruita, Jim gathered the donations from organizations listed on the founda-

Jim introduced the Memorial on July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2003 in remembrance of his Brother, Tom Doody, who piloted a helicopter just like the one behind Jim. He was shot down in February 8<sup>th</sup>, 1971. Jim has been hosting the event since it's founding in 2003. He is an inspiration to the honor of Veteran's Day, giving us a prime example of how this day should be treated whether you are a civilian, Boy Scout or the Marching Band.

# Grand Junction TREE LIGHTING Ceremony

As daylight fades and Main Street fills with what looks like an enormous turnout to greet Santa, Mesa Outloud warms our hearts and bodies with a stunning musical performance. The annual event, which shuts down the intersection of Main and 4<sup>th</sup> street downtown Grand Junction, has been a tradition for years. As some parts of the tradition are left behind, new aspects start appearing.

Known as a Cappella Group, Mesa Out!oud is an audition based singing group that has started becoming a tradition for the Downtown Tree Lighting Ceremony. Each voice brings a unique element to the singsong performance, which is done without musical instruments. Delighted to do what they love and share it with everyone, their smiles and passion electrify the crowd, who are eager to see where the beautiful melody is coming from. The singers are mostly seasoned from the previous year, but a couple of new faces have made their way to the spotlight, which has grown tremendously. Formed in 2014 for a spe-





cific performance, Taste of CMU at the Denver Center for the Performing Arts, President Foster and the Board of Trustees decided to create a permanent community outreach and touring group, Mesa Out-!oud. Under the direction of CMU's director of Music and Theatre Arts and Head of the department, Mo LaMee, Mesa Outloud is a show ensemble that focuses on contemporary commercial music from the American Songbook and the Broadway stage to current chart-topping favorites. Kylie Carroll, Marge Brophy, Siana Gutierrez (student director), Isa Sanchez, Nic Rhodes, Hao Tran, Donovan Kriskowski,

Jake Lende, and Ryan Heinsheimer make up the cast list for the 2022 season. They have performed for the Grand Junction Farmer's Market, CMU's Donors and Scholars Event, a dinner hosted by Bob and Louise Sammons for contestants at Porks 'n' Hops, and for Community Hospital's Annual Gala.




The Mesa is a great way to connect. Not only with people, but nature and the very reason why Mesa County is a great place to live; Recreation! We should be very thankful each season gives us a plethora of activities. Some wouldn't be available without the assistance of people and organizations dedicated to preserving these areas.

The Grand Mesa Nordic Council has a long history of making winter recreation accessible to the general public. For 30 years the Nordic Council, a nonprofit supporting Cross Country Skiers, has been promoting a safe and fun area for skiers of all ages and abilities.

Working through the summer, volunteers do trail work cleanup. clearing debris and replacing signs in preparation for winter. More recently they also started excavating stumps and boulders to make grooming easier for years with less snow pack says Melissa Newell, Events & Volunteer Coordinator for the Nordic Council.

This year the Grand Mesa Nordic Council has a number of free events the community might be interested in. Their free ski clinic is available for beginner and first time skiers, but they will continue to offer skate and classic ski clinics throughout the sea-Continued p.22















son. Women's Wednesday ski clinics are held throughout the season and they also offer paid Ski Clinics starting in mid December.

The Grand Mesa Nordic Council is also hosting a Full Moon Ski & Bon Fire party social Sunday December 4th at 5:30 -7:30pm at County Line Trail head. There is a "Family Fun" Day coming up on December 17th from 10am - 2pm where free ski rentals will be available for the whole family brought to us by one of their partner organization, The Nature Connection.

Other groups they work with are the Grand Valley Nordic Ski Club, which is geared toward adolescence and Colorado Discover Ability whose mission is "to increase the independence, self confidence, self worth and education of people with disabilities through out door recreation".



Grand Mesa Nordic Council operates under a special use permit with U.S. Forest Service, part of the Department of Agriculture and relies completely on voluntary and grant contributions to pay for trial grooming, maintenance operations, the warming hut, ski clinics and events.

They suggest a \$75 per year contribution to ensure continued world class skiing and grooming in one of the best Nordic areas, the wilderness of Grand Mesa National Forrest.
