# Family Ski Day





Grand Mesa Nordic Council and The Nature Connection brings you a fun filled, cross country ski adventure for the entire family!

On a delightful December 2022 day, we join families from across counties to one special spot on the Mesa. All here for the same reason, people of all ages were welcome to participate in the Family Ski Day. Held every year, this event attracts people from Delta, Olathe and the Grand Valley.

With help from the Delta Rotary Club and Great Outdoors Colorado, the Grand Mesa Nordic Council and partner organization, The Nature Connection, were able to bring the community a "Ski Lending" program. Promoting and encouraging outdoor activities in the community, and specifically, the Mesa, these organizations work together to create a safe, fun environment for people to try cross country skiing. As staff members such as Tori Swift and Anna Robinson, seen at the top left, get people fitted and ready, they also serve as basic standing and operating instructors.

Once the first few falls are out of the way, people are then pointed to an area where lessons were being taught by folks who know what to do. Given obstacles to maneuver around, teachers watch closely and give tips where they can. First time skiers listen closely if they know whats good for them! The experience of people

such as Jim Brown, seen to the right, serious in his mission to teach. extends to 1974!



As a member of the Delta Rotary Club, Jim came to the Mesa with the intent to help. Since he has 50+ years skiing experience, Jim instructs students how to stay on their feet, not cross skis and keep from rolling around in the snow.

Some kids prepared for a youth race, and some just want the ability to keep upright. Whatever the case, fun is the motivation. It doesn't stop in December though. You can participate in the Ski Lending program as well. On the 21st of January, The Nature Connection is hosting another ski

day from 10am to 2pm, and February 11th at the same time, at County Line Trailhead. You are welcome to bring the family; sizes go down to about a 4 year olds.

The Nature Connection would also like to remind everybody that the fun continues in the summer. They offer school year programs and summer camps for ages 7-11 years old in Hotchkiss,

## Christmas Tree

Taking the family out to cut larger tree species to access importtheir very own Christmas tree down can be fun and exciting. It also helps take care of our National Forests and can be environmentally friendly. People opposed to cutting down Christmas trees may like to know some of the positive affects it can have.

The permit is only \$8 bucks. You can get 5 per household, meaning you could very well donate one to a family that can't make the trip, or afford their own.

Because there are a number of very densely populated areas in our forests, Brittany Perrin from the U.S. Forest Service says, "Cutting a Christmas tree on National Forest can provide several positive environmental impacts on forest health. Cutting from a dense stand of trees reduces competition between trees and allows

ant resources such as sunlight, moisture and nutrients so they may grow stronger".

Brittany also states that with more resources available to the larger trees, they become stronger and more resistant to disease and insect infestations. The densely populated areas are also more prone to fire danger. Being proactive and thinning the forest can reduce fuel if a fire does happen.

With sales of permits in 2021 totaling 3,852 for the Grand Mesa, Uncompangre and Gunnison National Forests, it seems more people than not would like to just buy their tree from the local supermarket. In 2023 it might be a great idea to start a new tradition and make a day out of getting your hands dirty and helping the

U.S. Forest service thin some of the overgrowth.

It should be noted that there are regulations to abide by. Brittany says the most common 36CFR261.6(a) "Cutting or otherwise damaging any timber, tree or other forest product except authorized by a special use authorization, timber sale contract or Federal law or regulation. This violation results in collateral forfeiture of \$100 for the first tree and \$50 for each additional up to \$500 + a \$30 processing fee.

If you do decide to make a fun day out of finding your Christmas tree

next year, make sure and come prepared. Areas right off the road might be less densely populated. Going in with snowshoes or, if you have one, a snowmobile might connect you with the perfect tree.




It's cold outside, the whole country has been hit with an arctic blast. We cuddle by heaters and can't bare to turn them off for a moment while we step away.


Jennifer says the cause of this fire is still under investigation; howev-
