The Working Artist Gallery in downtown Grand Junction is home to more than 90 featured artists. Full of unique pieces from all over Colorado, this little shop provides a huge opportunity to bring home something that nobody else has.

From jewelry and paintings, to sculptures and pottery, the Working Artist Gallery has plenty to offer. To the right, behind the counter is Shirley Smith working on jewelry in an inspiring work atmosphere. She is one of four artists that also work at the location. Ronie says she has been working with stained glass for 15 years. After working with the previous owner of the Working Artist Gallery, Jackie Moore, Ronie was delighted to purchase the business when Jackie retired.

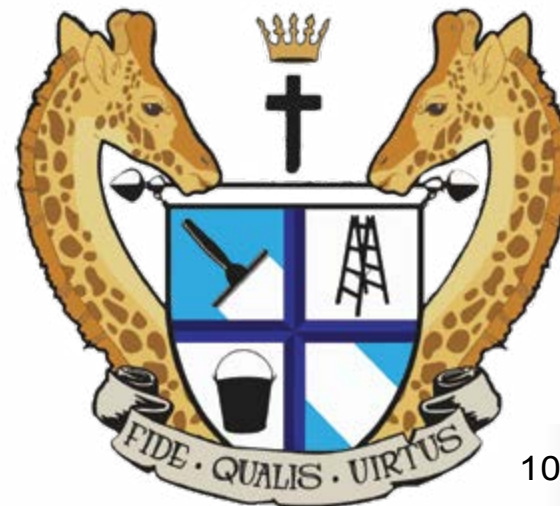
