

We were also competing with another event, which was an unfortunate tribulation. Because the amphitheater is quite expensive to rent, and the Alliance is a non-profit group providing scholarships, we are considering other plac-

The bands such as the Latin Knights and Alto, seen to the top, liked the venue as well, but would also like to see Cinco De Mayo back on Main Street. Drummer Carlos says the vibe seems to be better, and the shade was a plus. The Latin Knights who are local have performed at 3 Cinco De Mayo Festivals and have been together since 2010. They enjoy playing this cultural music, which was played to them as kids and they want to pass the tradition along. 
